A message from our president

The first five years. Mission Hospital has been an institution of clinical excellence in Western North Carolina for more than 130 years. As we mark the five-year anniversary of Mission Health joining HCA Healthcare, this year's report proudly reflects the array of achievements that have provided profound benefit to our communities during that time. Adjusting to change does not happen overnight and even now, we are still adapting and growing - all with the goal of improving care for our region.

In our first year, we opened the North Tower at Mission - a \$400 million. 650,000 square foot, state-of the-art project. Soon after, we received our first COVID patient. In this uncertain time in recent history, HCA Healthcare provided financial security to our colleagues, access to personal protective equipment, and delivered vaccines to staff and community members across WNC. That was no small feat, yet our teams remained resilient and dedicated to delivering excellent care.

HCA Healthcare has also made significant investments to expand and elevate the healthcare of WNC. We recently opened the new 120-bed inpatient behavioral health hospital, Sweeten Creek Mental Health & Wellness Center, which brings 38 additional, much needed beds to the region. We opened the \$68 million Angel Medical Center in Franklin and expanded capacity at Mission Hospital McDowell. Additionally, we created the area's first and only Burn and Wound Center, expanded CarePartners Rehabilitation Hospital, modernized the space in Mission Hospital's Women's and Children's units, and opened the area's only pediatric ER.

Our investments are not without

challenges. Our emergency rooms have seen an influx of patients that have regularly stretched our capacity. Mission Health has worked diligently to recruit and retain our staff, investing more than \$20 million in annual raises for our direct patient care colleagues. We have been able to invest in graduate medical education programs and partner with Galen College of Nursing to open a new campus in Asheville, fostering the next generation of nurses and their continued education.

HCA Healthcare has invested several millions of dollars in advanced surgical technology, including more than 10 robotic platforms to create minimally invasive options not previously possible at Mission facilities. Mission Hospital attained Magnet® recognition, and both Blue Ridge Regional Hospital and Angel Medical Center achieved Pathway® designation as a reflection of our nursing professionalism. The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) also awarded 5-star ratings for Blue Ridge Regional Hospital, Mission Hospital McDowell and Transylvania Regional Hospital.

All of this - and more - in five short years. I am thankful and proud of our caregivers for the work they do every day to live our mission: Above all else, we are committed to the care and improvement of human life. We look forward to the next 130 years and more of caring for our WNC communities.



Fighting food insecurity

Many Americans lack access to nutritious food, which is associated with increased risk for multiple chronic health conditions. To help address this health disparity, HCA Healthcare partnered across the country with local organizations such as MANNA Foodbank, our Feeding America network serving Western North Carolina's 200+ partner pantries.

Through the HCA Healthcare Food and Nutrition Drive, we contributed:

- 6,700 pounds of donated food and 440 volunteer hours at area pantries
- \$24K+ in company contributions to food security organizations



As part of the campaign, **Highland-Cashiers Hospital** won the top prize in the national "Food Sculpture Contest," resulting in a \$35,000 donation shared by their food pantry partners, the International Friendship Center and Loaves & Fishes Food Pantry of Cashiers. The design – a giant bear patient with a broken arm constructed out of 850 cans of food – was based on the Teddy Bear Clinics the hospital offered to kids across the community throughout the year.

HCA Healthcare is dedicated to developing a leading network of teaching hospitals, and it is no different at Mission Health. By partnering with Mountain Area Health Education Center (MAHEC), we offer a rigorous graduate medical education (GME) program. In 2023, we helped facilitate and host 173 residents and fellows.

At the end of 2023, HCA Healthcare's GME network was compromised of **72 teaching hospitals** with **304 programs** educating **5,185 residents and fellows**.

Physician spotlight: Head and Neck Specialists of WNC

In October 2023, Dr. Paul Davis and Dr. Steven Dennis brought new skills and expertise to Asheville and surrounding regions by helping to open a new practice, Head and Neck Specialists of Western North Carolina. For the first time, WNC has experts who are highly specialized in complex head and neck

cancers, which can appear in the skin, mucous membranes (mouth, throat, sinuses, nose), and the salivary, thyroid and parathyroid glands.

Dr. Davis attended medical school at Wake Forest University, and he completed a fellowship at the University of Auckland, Australia. Dr. Dennis attended the University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston and the University of California (Davis) Medical Center for his residency.

We are incredibly fortunate to have the skills of this powerhouse duo and value their unwavering advocacy for their patients and this community. We look forward to seeing the many lives that will benefit from their expertise.

The future of healthcare

HCA Healthcare has implemented new virtual care pilot programs at more than 10 facilities in nearly 10 states over the past two years, including Mission Hospital.

Virtual nursing adds experienced, fully licensed nurses to the care team providing routine but important and time-intensive administrative tasks via video conferencing that supports the patient bedside experience. Similar to telehealth, this real-time, two-way communication between patient and healthcare provider is for issues that do not require physical tests or examinations. The remote nurse offers additional information and time to address questions, in collaboration with a bedside nurse who provides physical care — the best of both worlds.

Many nurses who participate in virtual nursing programs are former bedside nurses with years of experience, and all are trained in their respective hospital's electronic health record system, processes and communication tools, helping to ensure seamless integration.



In terms of what the virtual care program can do for the future of nursing, Phillip Shanaghan, a registered nurse at Mission Hospital, explained how this is already proving to be beneficial in his daily workflow.

"I think it's going to make time management much easier. What we deal with in nursing everywhere is the influx of charting, which takes time away from hands-on care because so much needs to be documented. The extra time virtual care affords us will be given back to patients, so we'll see their satisfaction go up as well." – Phillip Shanaghan, RN



The gold standard in nursing

Mission Hospital is one of American Nurses Credentialing Center's 591 Magnet hospitals, working toward our second designation. The Magnet Recognition Program elevates patient and family-centered care and nursing excellence worldwide by setting the standard for excellence through nursing leadership, scientific discovery, and dissemination and implementation of new knowledge.

As a result, some of Mission Hospital's accomplishments in 2023 include:

- Outperforming national certification and education goals for nurses
- Continuing a robust program in nursing research led by a Nurse Scientist Scholar with 18 completed and seven ongoing nurse-led research projects
- Outperforming nursing quality and safety benchmarks in falls, hospital-acquired infections, surgical events, pediatric peripheral IVs, pressure ulcer prevention and assaults on nursing
- Significant improvement in turnover with Mission Hospital at approximately half the national benchmark
- Significant support of the new graduate nurse, including the Journey's Mentorship Program, resource nurses, and nurse educators devoting significant time to the direct care nurse
- Innovative care delivery models, including Nurse Extern Program for Certified Nursing Assistants (CNA)
- Innovative education models, including the Nurse Intern Program (100 hours for senior nursing students as a precepted experience)
- Unique strategies to promote engage including the International Educated Nurses Council

An RN Satisfaction Survey demonstrated outperformance of national benchmarks in nursing engagement, including RN-RN interaction, interprofessional relationships, Nurse Manager leadership, and professional development opportunities.

Academic partnerships

We support the educational pipeline for nurses with investments of funding, faculty, clinical rotations and school outreach to inspire and equip future nurses in Western North Carolina.

Expanding nursing programs

- Funding full-time faculty positions for nursing programs resulting in increased student admissions at Asheville-Buncombe Technical Community College's Practical Nursing Program, Blue Ridge Community College and Western Carolina University
- Providing new nursing clinical rotations within our facilities for Blue Ridge Community College and Southwestern Community College
- Providing eight adjunct clinical faculty for three different partner schools to assist in the training of the next generation of healthcare professionals
- Donating medical equipment and surgical supplies to support learning simulation labs

Starting early to inspire our youth

- Sending Mission Health's Mobile Simulation Lab to 15 local high schools to teach health science students about healthcare careers, hands-on CPR and AED training
- Engaging with middle and high school students through high school career fairs and classroom presentations
- Presenting "Nursing.... One Career... Multiple Paths" to middle schoolers across the state in the NC Governor's Students@Work program

In safe hands

The safety and healing of our patients is a priority at Mission Health. We are dedicated to providing the best clinical outcomes and patient safety protocols. As best practices evolve, we also continuously work to improve our own superior standards. The awards and accolades we receive on paper validate the quality patient care that our teams consistently provide in our facilities. Along with many more, we earned these designations in 2023.



Healthgrades 50 Best Hospital – Mission Hospital was again named among the top 1% in the nation for providing the highest clinical quality. Healthgrades uses objective quality measures including clinical outcomes and patient safety, as well as patient experience.

Healthgrades Top 100 for Cardiac Care – Mission Hospital received the recognition as one of the top 100 hospitals for cardiac care - the only hospital in North Carolina and South Carolina. This ranking recognizes superior patient outcomes in heart bypass surgery, coronary interventional procedures, heart attack treatment, heart failure treatment and heart valve surgery.

5 Star CMS Rating – Mission Hospital McDowell, Blue Ridge Regional Hospital and Transylvania Regional Hospital received a five-star rating for Overall Hospital Quality for 2023 from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS)



3 Stars Society of Thoracic Surgery – Mission Hospital's Cardiovascular Surgery Program received a 3-star recognition rating in CABG, AVR-CABG and Lobectomy - the highest rating from the Society of Thoracic Surgeons. Only 5-6% of the programs across the country receive 3-stars.

Medication Assisted Treatment – Mission Hospital and Blue Ridge Regional Hospital were among eight hospitals in North Carolina chosen to participate in a pilot program to coordinate Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) initiation in emergency rooms. Research shows a person is most at risk for an opioid overdose after a previous one has just been reversed. In this pilot program, patients at participating emergency rooms undergo screening for possible MAT candidacy using the clinical opioid withdrawal scale. An emergency room physician will initiate MAT treatments, then nurses and social workers connect that patient to a follow-up appointment with an addiction specialist.

Angel Medical Center is a full-service, critical access hospital operating 25 beds serving Macon and the surrounding counties. As part of Mission Health, Mission My Care Now - Angel and CarePartners Hospice & Palliative Care are also available for the community. Angel Medical Center has been named an Acute Stroke Ready hospital by the Joint Commission and American Heart Association/American Stroke Association. The hospital also includes a full-service ER with 17 beds.



Highlands-Cashiers Hospital is a 25-bed critical access hospital serving Macon, Jackson and the surrounding counties. The hospital offers 7 beds for 24/7 emergency care, acute inpatient care, outpatient surgical services and rehabilitation, as well as long-term, skilled nursing care through the 80-bed Eckerd Living Center (ELC). ELC offers an interdisciplinary team including nursing; occupational, speech and physical therapy; dieticians; activities and social services specializing in short- or long-term rehabilitation to maintain or improve your loved one's physical abilities.



In 2023, Highlands-Cashiers Hospital hosted a successful series of Teddy Bear Hospital events designed to familiarize children with medical procedures and alleviate any fears they might have about healthcare settings. Mission Health's flagship hospital, Mission Hospital is located in Asheville and has been serving Western North Carolina since 1885. The hospital is licensed for 853 beds with 94 ER beds and includes the region's only Level II trauma center, NICU and children's hospital. Mission Hospital is Western North Carolina's only Comprehensive Stroke Center, providing patients with the most advanced care for stroke.

Sweeten Creek Mental Health and Wellness Center Opens

Fulfilling another commitment HCA Healthcare made to Western North Carolina, Mission Health opened the new Sweeten Creek Mental Health and Wellness Center (SCMHWC) in November 2023. This **\$65 million**, **82**,000 square foot behavioral health hospital cares for patients aged four through geriatric and offers 38 additional beds from the previous facility. Located on 25 acres off Sweeten Creek Road in Asheville, SCMHWC offers 120 beds and separate units by age group, while outdoor courtyards provide play equipment in the pediatric outdoor space, a basketball court in the adult space, and a walking trail in the geriatric space.

This campus of Mission Health is designed specifically to care for those needing acute inpatient behavioral health care or outpatient programs such as our Intensive Outpatient Program or Partial Hospitalization Program.
