In addition, longitudinal continuity clinic occurs at the Frist Clinic on the TriStar Centennial Medical Center campus where residents will provide care to patients one of every five weeks.





Eligibility and Selection of Residents

- A. Residents in ACGME-accredited programs must be selected based on qualifications that meet or exceed the standards below.
 - 1. Graduates of medical schools in the U.S. and Canada accredited by the Liaison Committee for Medical Education (LCME); or,
 - 2. Graduates of osteopathic medicine in the U.S. accredited by the Commission on Osteopathic College Accreditation (COCA); or,
 - Graduates of medical schools outside the U.S. or Canada who have received a currently valid certificate from the Educational Commission for Foreign Medical Graduates (ECFMG); or,
 - 4. Applicants must be recent (two or fewer years) graduates from medical school to be considered. Special exceptions may be considered for:
 - a. Candidates with an M.D. or D.O. with a M.P.H./M.S./Ph.D. and extensive prior research experience after completion of an LCME- or a COCA- accredited medical or osteopathic medical school in the U.S. or Canada;
 - b. Candidates who have served a prolonged period as a general medical officer in the U.S. military;
 - c. Candidates who have successfully completed an ACGME- or AOAaccredited residency program in the U.S. or Canada.
 - 5. All requisite prior training must be successfully completed prior to beginning any residency program.
 - 6. Applicants must have passed United States Medical Licensing Examination (USMLE) Step 1 and Step 2 CK or the Comprehensive Osteopathic Medical Licensing Examination (COMLEX-USA) Level 1 and both components of Level 2.

- B. Programs will select candidates to interview only from among the pool of eligible applicants, evaluating each applicant based on their preparedness, ability, aptitude and academic background (to include clerkship grades, standardized test scores, communication skills and humanistic qualities, such as motivation, honesty and integrity).
- C. All residency programs are required to use the Electronic Residency Application Service (ERAS) to receive and accept applications to the program. All residency programs will also participate in the National Resident Matching Program (NRMP) as the primary method of recruiting trainees. All applicants who are granted interviews must interview prior to the initial match process. Exceptions may be made for fellowship or other programs not going through ERAS.
- D. For residents attempting to transfer, the residency program must first seek permission from the HCA Healthcare GME Division Vice President to consider the transfer. If permission is granted, then the receiving program must receive verification of each applicant's level of competency in the required clinical field using ACGME or CanMEDS Milestones assessments from the prior training program.
- E. The compliance with applicable federal and state law, the hospital does not discriminate against individuals with regard to race, color, religion, gender, national origin, age, disability, sexual orientation, gender identity, genetic information or protected veteran status, or status in any group protected by federal, state and local law.
- F. Hospital training programs do not sponsor visas. The Educational Commission for Foreign Medical Graduates (ECFMG) is the sole sponsor of J-1 physicians in clinical training programs. For more information, please visit www.ecfmg. org.

TriStar Centennial Medical Center is a tertiary care facility in downtown Nashville, serving patients from Tennessee, Alabama, Georgia, Kentucky and Mississippi. TriStar Centennial, HCA's first hospital, opened in 1969 and today represents the most innovative and extensive patient services available in the HCA Healthcare TriStar Division. In partnership with its medical staff, TriStar Centennial continues to innovate and develop groundbreaking clinical programs that continue the vision set by its founders Dr. Thomas Frist, Sr., Jack Massey and Dr. Thomas Frist, Jr. TriStar Centennial has achieved the highest rating from Leapfrog for patient safety for the eighth consecutive year, an unprecedented achievement. **TriStar Centennial Heart & Vascular Center** is a national leader in cardiac imaging, heart failure, interventional cardiology and electrophysiology, including atrial fibrillation management, surgical intervention and more. Our heart specialists were the first in middle Tennessee to offer minimally invasive and beating heart surgery. The program has advanced to include the establishment of a VAD (Ventricular Assist Device) and ECMO (Extracorporeal Membrane Oxygenation) program. The Heart and Vascular Center was also the first hospital in Nashville to join the National Cardiogenic Shock Network.

TriStar Centennial Women's Hospital cares for women at every stage of life offering maternity, high-risk obstetrics, maternal fetal medicine, neonatal, gynecological, surgical, and oncology services. Minimally invasive and robotic surgery for gynecologic and bladder conditions are offered as well. The hospital is home to the first OB/GYN Emergency Department in Nashville and offers a 24/7 obstetrical hospitalist program.

Sarah Cannon Cancer Institute at TriStar Centennial is part of the Sarah Cannon global network offering oncology services for the prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of cancer. This includes medical and radiation oncology, clinical research trials, tumor profiling, patient navigation, genetic counseling, rehabilitation, advanced stereotactic treatment and Ask Sarah 24/7 call center.

TriStar Centennial Parthenon Pavilion is Nashville's largest and most established behavioral health hospital. It is the only psychiatric hospital in Tennessee connected to a tertiary medical center, allowing for a full continuum of care. In addition to the adult inpatient care, partial hospitalization and intensive outpatient programs are also offered.

The Children's Hospital at TriStar Centennial delivers excellence in 19 pediatric services represented by board-certified specialists. Services include a Level III





NICU, pediatric, medical/surgical unit, pediatric surgery, pediatric hematology and oncology, pediatric intensive care and NICU transport. 24/7 pediatric emergency care is available with board-certified and fellowship trained pediatric emergency physicians in a dedicated child-friendly and autism-friendly Pediatrics Emergency Department.

TriStar Centennial Advanced Joint Replacement Institute (AJRI) is a "hospital in a hospital" concept, which offers a personalized treatment plan for each patient. AJRI partners with the region's top orthopedic surgeons to provide state- ofthe-art treatment using advanced procedures and technology including robotic surgery. Patients are treated by orthopedic surgeons who are leaders in the latest research studies for the advancement of orthopedic surgical care. Additionally, the hip and knee replacement programs have received certification from the Joint Commission, recognizing high-quality, consistent and safe approaches to care that result in better patient outcomes and satisfaction.

2019-2020 Highlights

- TriStar Centennial Children's Hospital pediatric hematologist/oncologist Dr. Haydar Frangoul (in partnership with Sarah Cannon Cancer Institute) was the first in the U.S. to pioneer sickle cell research to treat a patient with CRISPR, a gene-editing technology.
- TriStar Centennial Heart and Vascular rated in the top 2% of cardiovascular programs nationally by the Society of Thoracic Surgeons.
- TriStar Centennial Heart and Vascular Center received Advanced Certification in Ventricular Assist Device (VAD) from the Joint Commission.
- TriStar Centennial Medical Center was the first hospital in Tennessee to use a robotic bronchoscopy platform to detect lung cancer in its earliest stages.
- TriStar Centennial Medical Center was the first hospital in Tennessee to use an optical imaging agent during fluorescence-guided surgery to treat high-grade gliomas.

- TriStar Centennial Medical Center finalized construction of its 8-floor parking garage with nearly 2300 parking spaces, pedestrian connector, and nearly 1 million square feet.
- TriStar Centennial Women's Hospital earned Best for Babies recognition from Tennessee Department of Health for efforts in breastfeeding rates, reducing early elective deliveries and safe sleep.
- TriStar Centennial Women's Hospital opened a Milk Bank Depot to safely donate frozen breast milk to infants in need within Tennessee.
- TriStar Centennial Women's Hospital implemented a C-section drape with a window, allowing immediate skin- to-skin contact while maintaining a sterile surgical field.
- TriStar Centennial Parthenon Pavilion was recognized by the Joint Commission for its national best practice of its "treatment mall" to providing group therapies, as well as the quality of individualized recovery plans, and focus on patient safety through use of technology for safety checks.
- TriStar Ashland City named one of the Top 20 Critical Access Hospitals in the county by the Chartis Center for Rural Health.
