Investing in accessible care

In 2023, HCA Florida Healthcare invested \$1.256 billion in capital to enhance access to care for Floridians—including the opening of new patient towers, renovations and expansions of facilities, and the construction of 13 new freestanding emergency rooms in rural and urban communities across the state.

We also invested in our workforce, hiring more than 4,800 nurses and increasing our total number of colleagues to more than 84,000 in 2023. That's more individuals to provide care for our neighbors and contribute positively to local businesses and utilities, boosting the vitality of communities throughout the Sunshine State.
